Do you suffer from chronic migraines?

CerCare is running a study for a new implantable medical device used as an alternative treatment for chronic migraines.

The device is called the ShiraTronics Migraine Therapy System. It is designed to provide mild electrical stimulation to the nerves associated with migraines in order to reduce the number, and pain intensity, of the migraines you experience.



What does the study involve?

The study will involve two surgical procedures. One will be to implant a temporary trial system, and the other to implant the full system if you tolerate the trial stimulation. As a part of the study, you would also be required to attend visits at the study site in Wayville throughout the 12-month study period.

→ Participant Criteria:

- 18 years or older
- Migraines occurring for at least 12 months
- Experiencing 15-26 headache days, including at least 8 migraine days, per month
- No prior treatment with a neurostimulator for headaches
- No botox injections for purposes other than managing migraines within the last 6 months
- No radiofrequency ablation within the last 12 months
- Not pregnant or breastfeeding
